

Importing your EndNote Library to Zotero (Windows)


1. In EndNote, navigate to the File Menu and select Export. Be sure you are exporting the entire library (this should be the default).




Be sure you are exporting the entire library (this should be the default). Set the export type
as XML. Save the export XML file in a place that's easy to locate, such as your
desktop or downloads folder.




3. In <u>Zotero</u>, choose File—Import. Leave the default settings (BibTex, RIS, Zotero RDF, etc.)






4. Navigate the XML file you saved, then select Open. Leave the default import settings in place and chose Open.



5. Select your preferred options and choose Next (default options displayed here).



6. Your references will be imported. If you have a large library, this may take several minutes or longer. Upon import, Zotero will identify retracted papers, and your citations will appear in the general library. You can organize into folders as in EndNote.
